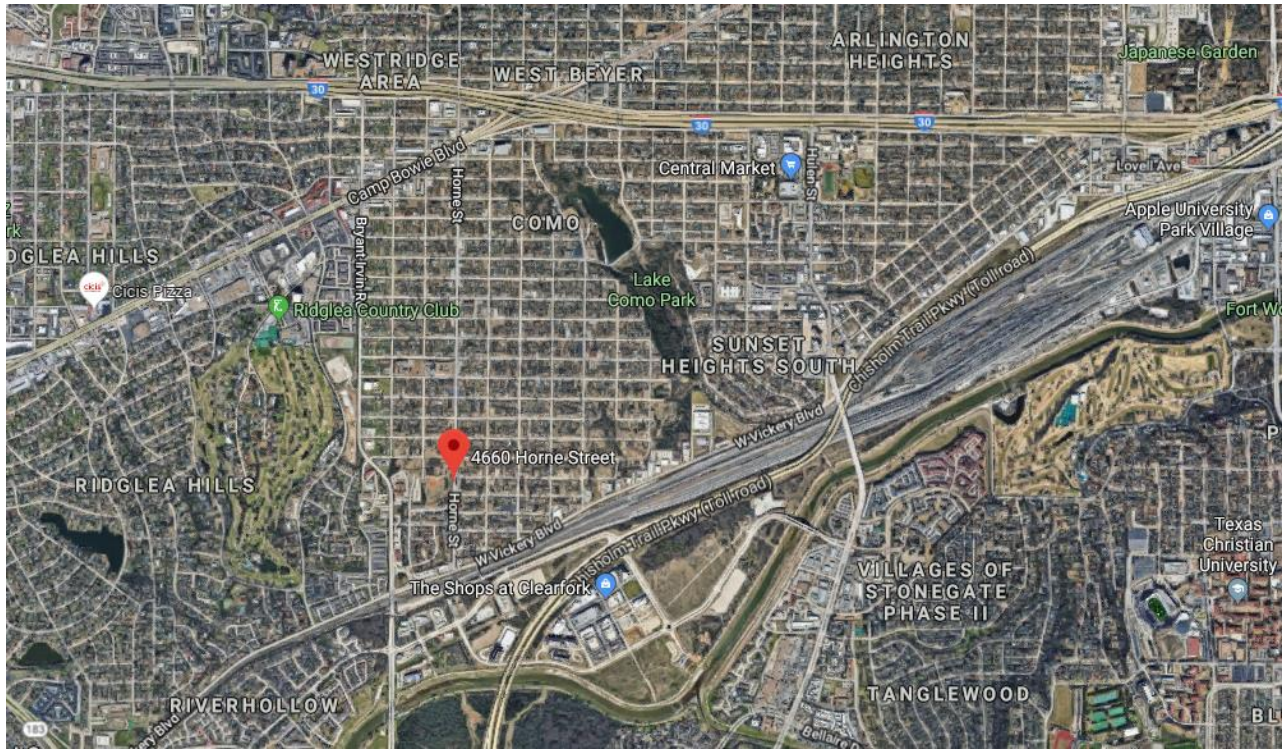


Como Community Center Public Art Project

Como Community Center, 4660 Horne Street, Fort Worth, Texas 76107

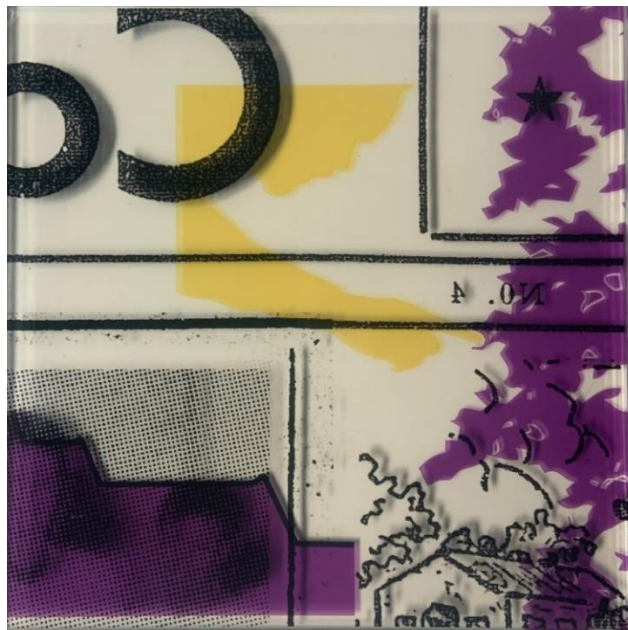


Narrative Description

Adam Neese will suspend glass artwork in three (3) bays of the front porch area at the new Como Community Center. The glass artwork will be held by a stainless steel channel system and supported by a steel I-beam system, to be painted in coordination with the building. The boxed area above corresponds with the location of the artwork as detailed below. The design offers a different perspective from outside to inside of the building. The work is intended to reflect the culture and spirit of the Como community both through imagery and text, bringing together past and present as a way of highlighting the bright future of Como.

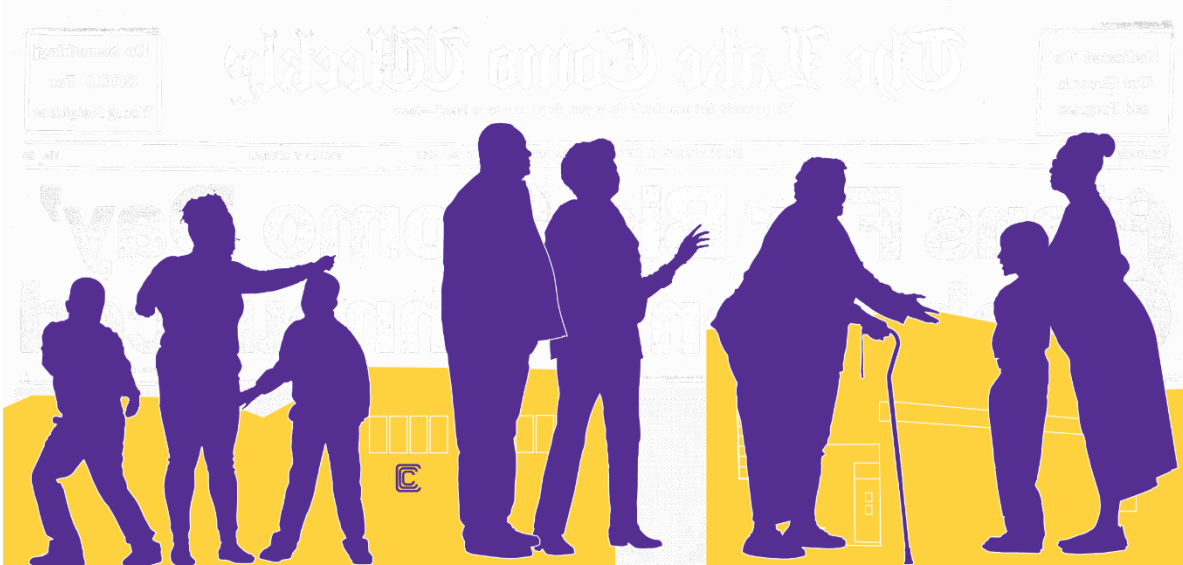
