Since 1936, the Will Rogers Memorial Center Coliseum has been the focal point of Fort Worth's efforts to host Western equestrian events. The economic impact of these events supports the city's visitor economy, which generates an estimated \$3,500,000,000.00 in revenues annually and employs over 30,000 Metroplex residents.

The facility is currently undergoing a planned \$50,500,000.00 renovation. Work on the project started in February of this year and is scheduled to be completed by November 2025. Under the Master Services Agreement between the City and Events Facilities Fort Worth (EFFW), EFFW is managing the project on the City's behalf.

The project has encountered an environmental remediation issue in the form of lead-based paint. The timeline of events concerning this issue is as follows:

- On May 27, 2025, Sedalco (Prime Contractor) and its subcontractor, Patriot, discovered the probable existence of lead-based paint on the structural steel (I-beams and trusses) inside the Will Rogers arena. New steel connections are needed to support new air ducts and HVAC systems. Public Events and Sedalco promptly notified the Environmental Services Department to assess the issue and determine next steps.
- On **June 3**, **2025**, Third-party laboratory testing confirmed the presence of lead (Pb) concentrations ranging from 160,000 ppm to 430,000 ppm (i.e., 16% to 43%), particularly in areas where remediation I is required prior to welding and fabrication.
- From June 3-18, 2025, Environmental Services led an effort to determine the most effective method to abate the lead-based paint from the steel structures

through a chemical process and a modified sand-blasting technique. The modified sand-blasting technique proved to be most effective in removing the lead-paint. Environmental Services recommended Intercon Environmental Inc., to complete the abatement due to their availability and capacity to complete the scope of the remediation.

- Phase 1 was completed approximately July 31, 2025. During the response to the identified remediation requirements, Sedalco and City personnel identified additional areas requiring immediate abatement. This emerging requirement became identified as Phase 2.
- To control costs, the City had requested that Intercon transition into Phase 2 upon completion of Phase 1. Phase 2 was completed as of **September 22, 2025**.
- Intercon Environmental Inc. charged the city for rental fees for additional lift equipment not included in the original invoice to ensure construction was able to maintain its current delivery schedule and an interest charge of 2% for total contract value of \$1,223,977.80.

Lead paint removal from structural components within Will Rogers Memorial Center qualifies as a procurement necessary because of unforeseen damage to City property. The ongoing renovations at Will Rogers include extensive steel reinforcement that was competitively bid as a part of the project. The discovery of lead paint presence on the structural beams is unforeseen damage because the presence of lead was not anticipated, and reinforcement process cannot proceed with the beams in this compromised condition. Additionally, the mere presence of lead paint poses a significant health risk to everyone involved in the project. The impacted area extends from the roofline down approximately 80 feet above the arena floor. The purchase will remedy the damage by removing lead paint from the property and will allow the project to continue without substantial deviation from the project timeline.

With this memo, staff requests emergency spending authority in an amount of Phase 1 - \$821,977.80 (completed) and Phase 2 - \$375,000.00, and Close Out - \$27,000.00 (total contract value of \$1,223,977.80) for a service request with Intercon Environmental, Inc. (Supplier ID 0000017132), located at 210 South Walnut Creek Mansfield, Texas 76063, Phone: (817) 477-9995. This request is based on the quote reference number: 250112.1 (see Attachment 1). Intercon Environmental, Inc. holds multiple agreements for general, on-call abatement services. The level of effort required for this project exceeds the typical annual contract authority previously allocated for their services.

The requested funds will be used for the removal of lead-based paint and primer from the underside of the arena roof superstructure spanning, which includes steel I-beams and trusses extending from the roofline down approximately 80 feet above the arena floor. Due to the complexity of this project and the extent of the proposed remediation, an amendment to this scope for additional labor, materials, and schedule is possible.

Environmental Services, in collaboration with Public Events, is drafting an M&C for City Council approval in October 2025.

Timely completion of the renovation is essential to maintaining WRMC's relationship with key clients, who relinquished contracted dates to allow the project to proceed. Any delays could also jeopardize the use of the Coliseum for the annual Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo, one of the community's signature events. These risks pose potential legal and financial liabilities to the City

due to lost event revenue.

Chapter 2, Article I, Section 2-9 at (9) of the City's Code of Ordinances and Section 252.022 of the Local Government Code exempts from normal bidding requirements expenditures that are necessary to preserve or protect the city's property and the public health or safety of the municipality's residents.
