Site: 1000 Echo Lake Drive, Fort Worth, Texas 76110, Council District 11

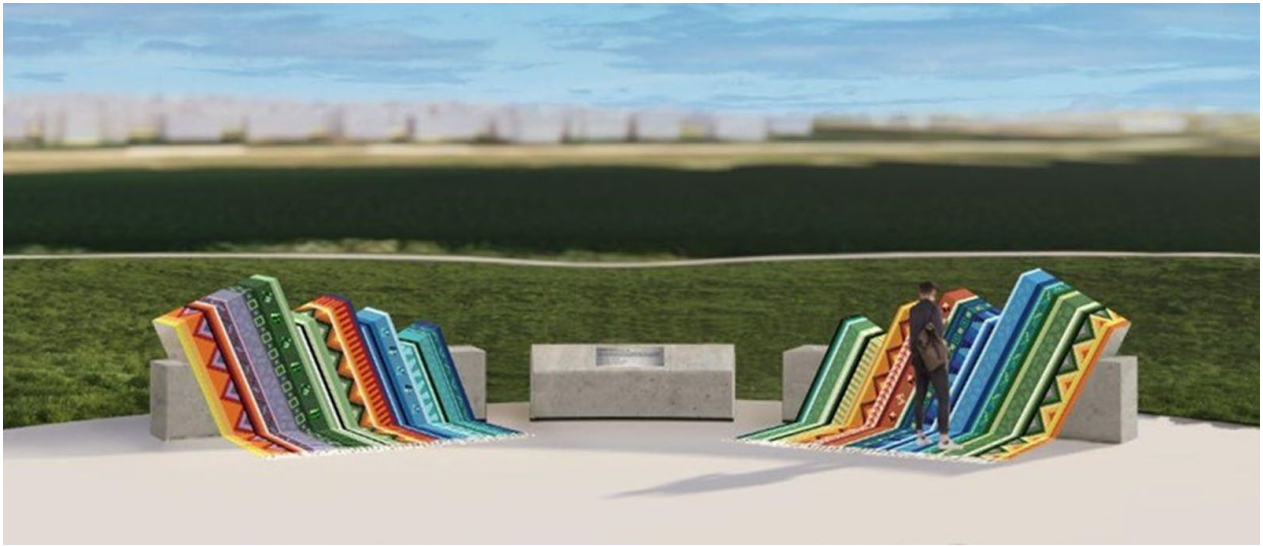


Narrative Description

Give One Studio's Final Design, *Echoes*, honors Ciquio Vasquez, for whom the park is named, and reflects community values, culture, and history. In response to the Project Core Team's interest in artwork that reflects the importance of creative play, education, and community building, the artist has designed two sculptural mosaic mural walls and connecting mosaic floor insets into the concrete plaza. Elements from the Mexican Serape blanket and African Kente cloth weave together the respective Latino and African American populations who reside nearby. The artwork will include various types of tiles including Mexican smalti and vitreous pixel glass tiles, photo tiles depicting the life and legacy of Mr. Vasquez, and community-crafted ceramic tiles.

The mosaic sculptures will span the east end of the Memorial Lookout Plaza, adjacent to the Worth Heights Community Center and overlooking Echo Lake. Connected to the trail system, the artwork will be visible from all angles within the park and along the main road, Cole Street. The sculpture ranges in height from three feet (3') to six feet (6').

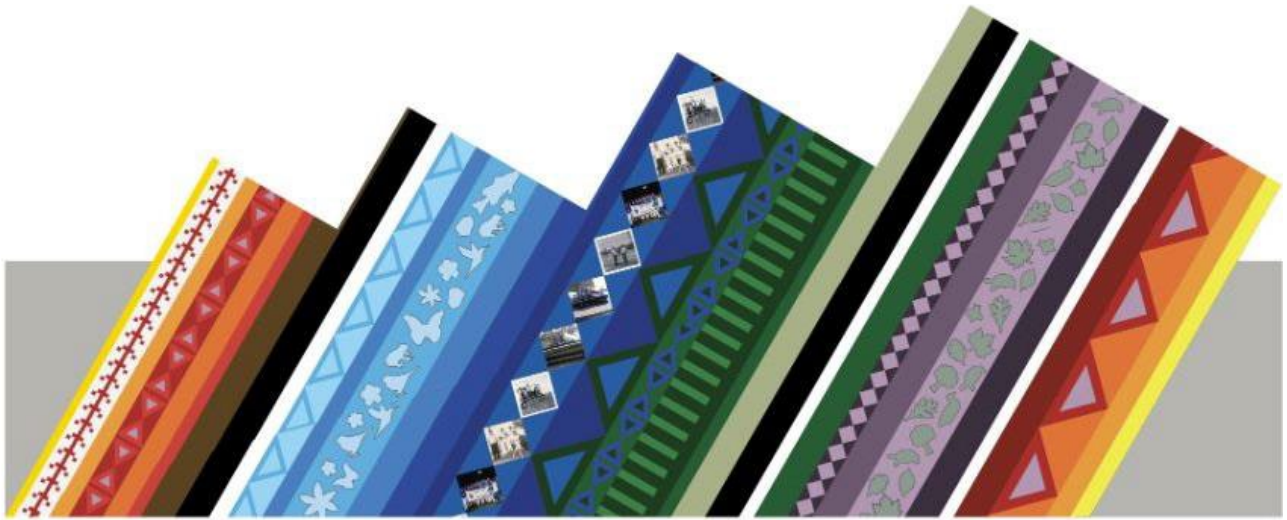
Final Design Rendering of *Echoes*

Sculptural mural walls: 3 – 6 feet high by 18 inches wide by 15 feet long.

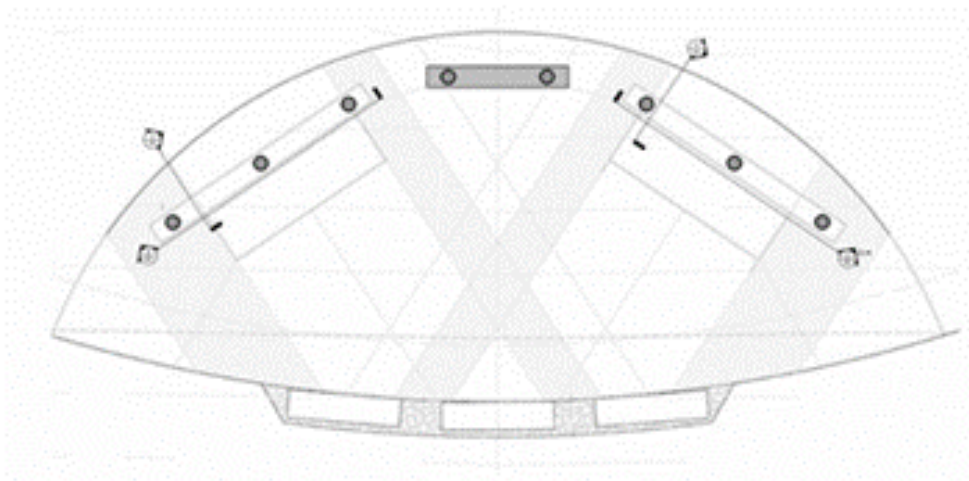
Mosaic mural floor insets: 12.75 feet long by 4 feet wide

Mosaic tiles: Mexican smalti, vitreous pixel glass, ceramic and photographic tiles
