Police, Fire and MedStar briefed the Council on the impacts of opioids in Fort Worth from their various perspectives. There will be a follow up presentation.

7. Briefing on Payday Lending Regulations – Randle Harwood, Planning and Development and Melinda Ramos, Law

Randle Harwood, Planning and Development and Melinda Ramos, City Attorney's Office presented an overview of Payday Lending including background, regulation of lenders, model ordinance from TML, common zoning regulations and some long term strategies. Staff will bring back information on education, potential partners, the TML model ordinance and where we have impacted existing businesses in the past that have survived in the community.

City Manager Cooke discussed the annual impact on proposed utility rate and fee increases and increases in property values. The approval of the stormwater rates will be separate from the budget approval. The stormwater rates will be presented on October 15, 2019, and will not be effective until January 1, 2020.
