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SUBJECT: JULY 2023 - SALES TAX UPDATE

Sales tax revenue represents approximately twenty-three (23%) percent of the City's General Fund anticipated revenue in Fiscal Year 2023. It is the second largest revenue source, with property tax being the largest at 58%. In addition, sales tax revenue represents the largest revenue source in the Crime Control and Prevention District (CCPD) Fund. Because sales tax represents a significant revenue source for the city and can sometimes be a volatile revenue stream, it is important for the city to closely monitor and report on monthly sales tax receipts.

The Texas Comptroller's Office posted July 2023 (Fiscal Year 2023, Period 10) collection results on September 7, 2023. Actual receipts are dependent upon the timeliness and accuracy of sales tax payers' returns. Recent years have included legislative reform on remitting sales tax to the state comptroller, effects of a historic winter storm, and the effects of a global pandemic. The FY2023 Adopted Budget for sales tax were estimated based on higher than expected recovery from the pandemic and the possibility for an economic recession. Due to the potential fluctuation in the revenue source, the City takes a conservative, yet realistic, approach to estimating sales tax.

July collections are comparable to the same month last year.

- The General Fund net sales tax collections as of July are 110.9% compared to the adopted budget, and 103.1% compared to the same month last year.
- The CCPD Fund net sales tax collections as of July are 110.9% compared to the adopted budget, and 103.7% compared to the same month last year.

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The following chart indicates how FY2023 net sales tax collections in Fort Worth and other select cities in the state compare to FY2022 collections for the same period.

According to the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts website, Comptroller Glenn Hegar states at the state-wide level that "Fiscal 2023 tax revenues were ahead of our projections in the Biennial Revenue Estimate released in January," Hegar said. "Franchise and insurance taxes were particularly strong in fiscal 2023. These taxes are based on the companies' activity in 2022, and year-over-year increases of 20 and 30 percent, respectively, are results of receipts elevated due to the high price of inflation last year. In addition, interest and investment income was up more than 72 percent in comparison with fiscal 2022, thanks to elevated interest rates and large cash balances in the state treasury."

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
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SUBJECT: JULY 2023 - SALES TAX UPDATE
