



## SUBJECT: SECURITY CAMERAS IN THE STOP SIX AREA

This informal report provides information about the status of City-owned security cameras operated by the Fort Worth Police Department (FWPD) in the Stop Six area. For the purposes of this report, the "Stop Six area" refers to several neighborhoods in Southeast Fort Worth as depicted in the following map.



FWPD currently operates a total of 44 cameras in the Stop Six area. The Stop Six neighborhood improvement program (NIP) funded 36 of these cameras, but four had malfunctions that rendered them inoperable; they were replaced with four cameras from the FWPD inventory. An additional eleven cameras have been installed in the Stop Six area after the NIP was completed.

Installation of cameras funded by the Stop Six NIP began near the end of 2017, and the expected life for the cameras is approximately five years. Three of the 36 cameras purchased through the Stop Six NIP have become inoperable and will be repaired or replaced. The work to maintain and replace cameras is ongoing as the number of cameras FWPD installs continues to grow throughout the city.
