(ALL) Authorize Application for and, if Awarded, Acceptance of an Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant from the United States Department of Energy in an Amount Up to \$785,490.00 to Support Energy Efficiency and Conservation Planning and Implementation, Authorize Execution of Related Grant Agreements, and Adopt Appropriation Ordinance

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Authorize the application for and acceptance of, if awarded, an Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant from the United States Department of Energy in an amount up to \$785,490.00 to support energy efficiency and conservation planning and implementation;
- 2. Authorize the City Manager to execute all applicable grant contracts including renewals and amendments; and
- 3. Adopt the attached appropriation ordinance increasing estimated receipts and appropriations in the Grants Operating Federal Fund in an amount up to \$785,490.00, subject to receipt of the grant, for the purpose of funding energy efficiency and conservation measures.

DISCUSSION:

The United States Department of Energy's Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) Program is designed to assist local governments in implementing strategies to reduce energy use, reduce fossil fuel emissions, and improve energy efficiency.

If awarded, the City of Fort Worth (City) will use grant funds to define a plan for energy efficiency, energy conservation, and energy usage goals for the City. Where feasible, funding will also allow for energy audits on select, prioritized City-owned facilities and City-maintained energy systems. These audits can inform energy saving and cost saving decisions. In addition, funding will be allocated to support public education and outreach about energy efficiency and important related information (e.g., available tax rebates and tax credits for residents).

Since no City salaries will be charged, indirect cost recovery does not apply.

This grant does not require local matching funds.
