The purpose of this Informal Report is to provide an update to the Mayor and City Council about **The Mayor's Community Engagement Workshops & 2019 Neighborhood Awards**, held on Saturday, Feb. 22 at the Bob Bolen Public Safety Complex, located at 505 W. Felix.

Event Preparation

During the summer of 2019, The Community Engagement Office offered the "In It to Win It: A Neighborhood Awards How-To Workshop" to share best practices, tips and examples with neighborhood leaders interested in applying for a neighborhood award. The workshop was offered to individuals, board leaders and in large-groups at the Hazel Harvey Peace Center for Neighborhoods.

Completed awards applications were accepted October 15 - December 18, 2019.

Members from the Neighborhood Engagement & Revitalization Alliance (NERA), an alliance of city staff representing over twenty DFW cities judged all award applications.

Workshops

After last year's event was held, more than 350 paper and online surveys from neighbors, exhibitors, workshop presenters and internal staff was received.
