The sculptures are symbols and metaphors from nature that remind us of the potential within all of us and the potential within an active community. 




Site 1: North East Corner - S. Lake Street and Magnolia Ave. (The Magnolia Pod)



Site 2: South West Corner - 5th Ave and Magnolia Ave (The Acorn)



Site 3: North East Corner - S. Henderson St and Magnolia Ave (The Pine Cone)



Artwork Design Materials Tests



Blown glass will be used for the nut seed of the acorn, with hands cast in bronze for the cap. Similarly, the pinecone petals will be cast bronze.



Protruding from the cast bronze magnolia seed pod will be cast glass seeds, made from molds of community members' hands. Similarly, small elements of the pinecone will be cast glass.
